Technology has changed the way homeowners care for and protect their homes. If you're looking for an upgrade that enhances safety while boosting convenience, total home automation is an investment to consider.

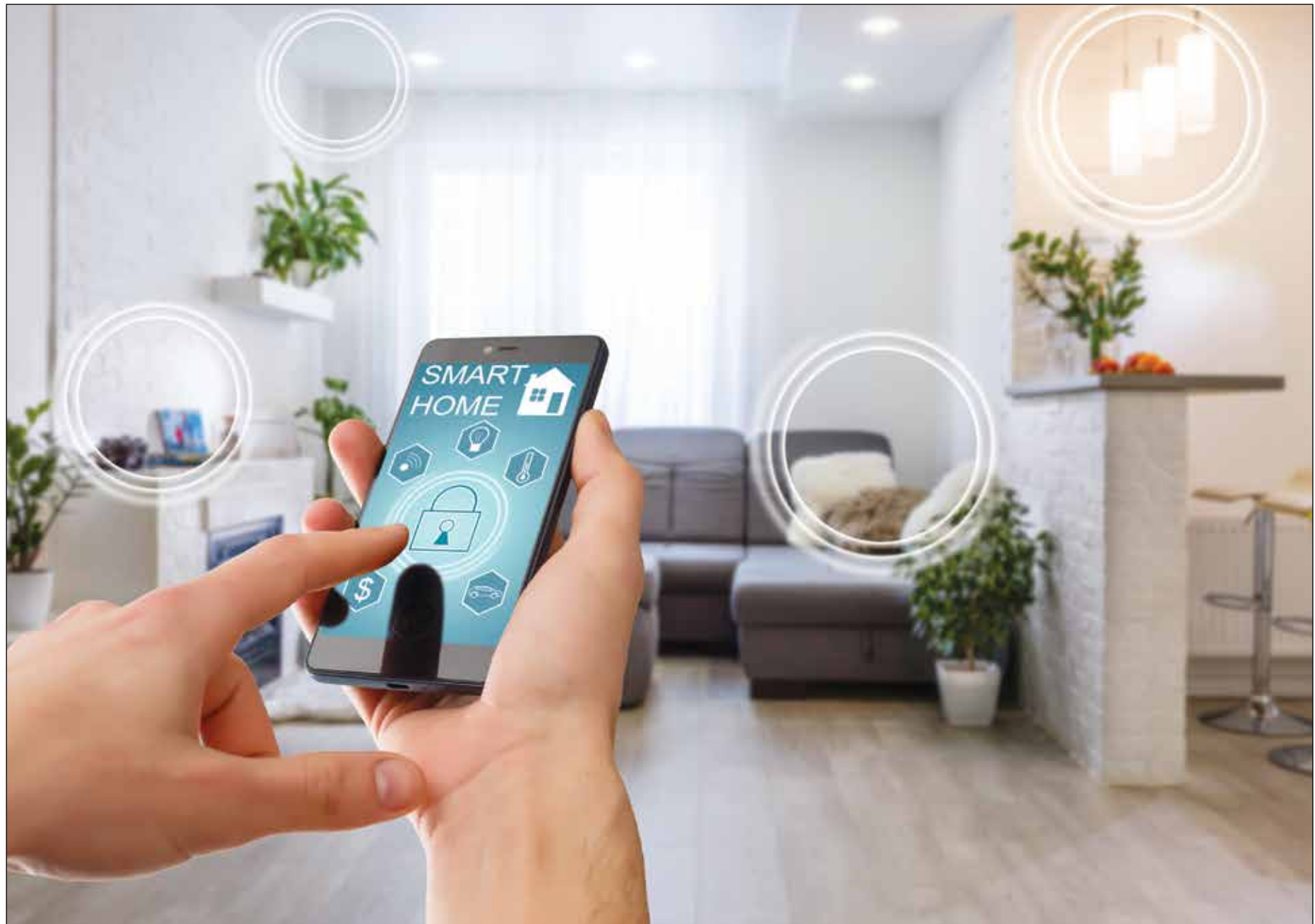
Since the systems are so intricate, it's beneficial to work with an expert in the field, so you don't miss out on life-changing features.

AUTOMATED DOOR LOCKS

NEW SHUTTERS

STAIN YOUR DECK

ELECTRICAL UPGRADES

Whether you're installing new outlets throughout the home or making major elec-

trical changes, hiring an electrician is a valuable resource. Working with a licensed professional ensures that the project is performed correctly and safely to protect your home and livelihood.

It is also possible that your homeowner's insurance will not cover damage caused by DIY electrical repairs. Make sure to check with your provider before you consider tackling a project on your own.

Paint a Staircase

The home's entry point to a second story can quickly become a focal point in any room. Whether the staircase features dated carpet or wood with cosmetic damage, touching up the covering can totally change the feel of the entire interior.

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PAINTING THE HANDRAIL AND BALUSTERS

Prior to painting the components on your staircase, apply coats to the wall that holds the steps and rails to ensure the chosen colors will blend together. Be careful to use quality ladders if the area is out of reach.

Once the backdrop is dry, you should mask the stairs with heavy butcher paper and painter's tape to avoid dripping as you paint around it.

As you coat the handrail, make sure to paint with the grain rather than against, to ensure an even coat. Next, cover the decorative balusters

with your chosen color. Even if these components will be the same color as the stairs, it's a good idea to wipe up any drops, as uneven drying may lead to unattractive lumps.

BEGINNING AND FINISHING THE STEPS

Once the stairs are ready for

their upgrade, it's a good idea to begin painting the underside of the first nosing before moving on the initial riser.

Try to start at the top and work your way down. If you will need to use the staircase before the paint can dry, only cover every other step. This will give you a path to use.

Here are some ideas to get you started on the journey of pallet repurposing.

CREATE A PALLET WALL

You can give your home an attractive accent wall by covering it with durable pallet wood



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and a little craftsmanship. Before you get started, measure the area to determine how much material will be needed. You should also gather tools like construction adhesive, a nail gun, a measuring tape and a table saw.

The first step is to apply a

coat of dark-colored paint to the wall that will be covered. Since pallet wood is rarely uniform, this will help cover gaps or small holes featured on the wood.

Next, sand the boards down before applying the caulk to the back and holding them in

place with brad nails. Starting at the top, stagger the boards' lengths so they don't line up with the pieces above or underneath to give your new wall a unique twist.
