pany about their qualifications before hiring them to transport you and your friends.


LIMOUSINE

Planning a prom can be an expensive affair. Sometimes, the school's budget needs extra funds to be able to pull off an event you will remember. Students can band together to raise funds.



ASK FOR HELP FROM LOCAL RESTAURANTS Another beneficial avenue

is to talk to locally owned restaurants in the area. Ask them to sponsor a schoolwide dining adventure where a commission for each plate is donated to the prom fund.

You can also ask if they have a punch-card promotion where customers can score great deals by buying a card from a student. If they don't have such an agreement in place, it may inspire them to begin one or even start a new creative charity drive strategy.

CAR WASH

Host a donation-based car wash on school property and invite parents and older students to join in on the fun. Consider making it a welcoming event by grilling food and offering drinks in the name of fundraising.
