Tie the room together by placing a vase of evergreen and red berries on a nearby table. The combination of the two will be a visual treat for

your guests.

SHIMMER AND SHINE

Another classic staple of holiday decorating is tinsel and garland. Vivid silver and gold strands running down the side of your staircase can help accentuate your decorated tree.

You can find metallic-colored leaves or simply add some jingle bells to your evergreen decorations for a

similar effect.

string.
