#### **PURPOSE**

A home inspector goes under the house to check the plumbing and verifies that the house meets your county and city safety code requirements.

He will also check for faulty electrical wiring, look for proper insulation and ventilation, check the roof for any leakage or weakened surfaces in need of repair, ensure that the home's structural system is safe, sound and built according to code, and inspect the interior and exterior of the property for damage.

Although the home may appear to be in mint condition, unseen factors can rack up a hefty repair bill and often take a bite out of any discount or bargain deal on a property.

#### CERTIFICATION

A certified home inspector is a licensed professional who will evaluate a property without bias toward the seller or buyer. You may investigate the credentials of your proposed home inspection company through the American Society of Home Inspectors to ensure its license is current and there are no disciplinary actions taken against the company.

In addition, your local Chamber of Commerce and the Better Business Bureau online are excellent resources to put you in touch with a qualified inspector. Shop

#### INSPECTION COST


The cost of a certified inspection service will vary only slightly from one company to the next and should be in a reasonable price range for an average-size home. In most cases, payment is required up front, whether you opt to purchase the home or not.

If your home inspector has provided you with a clear and concise report, you may wish to keep that company on file and use its services again. The home inspection process should be reserved for only that property that you fully intend to buy and consider the inspection service as reassurance that the property is move-in ready and does not need costly repairs.

If your desired property is lacking in the essential functions of the home, your home inspector may give you an estimate for the repairs and better equip you to make a decision as to whether the property is worth the asking price.
