This is a popular choice but can be dangerous if your door is near a window, as a burglar can easily shatter the glass and reach in to unlock the bolt.

Double-bolt system: You'll need a key to unlock the bolt from both the inside and outside. While this can protect your point of access, it can be incredibly dangerous for homeowners who must quickly escape a home due to fire or other type of emergen-

### **Going Keyless?**


