"Offering a range of pragmatic hues infused with vilifying bright pops, colors for Autumn/Winter 2021/2022 offer a plethora of possibilities that support our lifestyle of continual reinvention and convey a promise of reemergence," said Leatrice Eiseman, executive director of the institute.

Here are 10 colors to look for this fall.

**Pantone 18-4434 Mykonos Blue.** A deep, brisk blue evocative of the Aegean Sea.

Pantone 13-40647 Illuminating. A vivid, joyful yellow that offers all the promise of a sunny day.

Pantone 18-6022 Leprechaun. A grassy Kelly green that's emblematic of the mythical Irish creatures.

**Pantone 18-2330 Fuchsia Fedora.** A vivid, flirtatious bold pink that Pantone says is packed with allure.

**Pantone 13-1716 Pale Rosette.** A gentle, endearing shell pink.

**Pantone 17-1340 Adobe.** A warm, rich brown reminiscent of sun dried clay.

**Pantone 18-1453 Fire Whirl.** A vigorous red with a dynamic presence.

**Pantone 19-3838 Rhodonite.** A balancing blue-based purple.

**Pantone 18-4221 Spring Lake.** A quiet and restful midtone blue.

**Pantone 19-1228 Root Beer.** An herbal brown that looks like the root bark of the sassafras tree.

The institute also identifies four core classics colors for this fall.

These colors' versatility and endurance perfectly complement the trendier colors and tend to stay in Pantone's color forecasting lists season after season.

Pantone 11-1007 Coconut Cream. A rich, velvety white.

**Pantone 17-5104 Ultimate Gray.** A reassuring, composed gray tone.

**Pantone 13-0919 Soybean.** A mild, companionable blonde beige.

**Pantone 18-0527 Olive Branch.** A tasteful green that's symbolic of new growth.

These colors, Pantone says, embrace calm and healing as well as hope and joyfulness, accommodating all the various possibilities of our lifestyles. The greens and blues in the palette are relaxing and comforting while the greens symbolize new growth and life.

Another classic design making a comeback for 2021 is the quilted jacket, particularly in denim or shades of blue. Try this layered with other fall staples for a perfectly comfortable (and very stylish) fall look.

### **ROBE-ALICIOUS**

Many of us spent a lot of 2020 in our bathrobes, it's no wonder that we'd figure out a

way to bring that outside in 2021. The robe coat is on trend this fall, with a long silhouette that comes to the knee or below, soft, curving lapels and a tie front. Look for a robe coat with a little texture in the fabric for +1 cozy.

## Accessorizing this Fall

### **SUPER SNOODS**

### **BOOT UP**

Fall is the boot's season to shine. They keep your tootsies toasty, but it's not so inclement yet that you have to break out the snow boots. This year, look for boots that climb high, even up to and above the knee. Use the season to your advantage and pair them with a mini dress and confidence as high as the top of your boots.

### **MOON BOOTS**

Soft, puffy moon boots are also back this year, made even more squishy by knitted and shearling accents. No less than Dolce & Gabbana showed the oversized, outdoorsy boots on their fall runways, as did Chanel and Miu Miu.

### **SOFT SANDALS**

The puff comes to sandals, too, with fall open-toed foot-wear such as stuffed-strap thongs and shearling foot beds with oversized knit straps.

### Rainy Day Footwear

Fall's (chilly) rains can bring some serious footwear pains. But modern advances in materials and designs mean that today's waterproof shoes aren't your grandmother's galoshes.

### **RAIN BOOTS**

If you live in a rainy climate, you probably have a pair or two of rain boots on hand. This year, you can even snag waterproof suede and other booties that are so chic, you'd wear them even when the sunshine's gone.

Cosmopolitan magazine recommends brands like Vince, which features a pair with a stylish block heel, and Ariat for a full-length equestrian look.

### **SNEAKERS**

These shoes keep the comfort while keeping your toes dry. Good Housekeeping rated a whole slew of waterproof sneaks, and named among their favorites Sorel, Blondo and Merrell kicks. Look for sneakers that fit your foot, are comfortable with plenty of support, and have a good gripping sole to keep your rear end off the wet pavement.

#### **BALLET FLATS**

Look cute in the office and keep your feet dry with a pair

of ballet flats that will stand up to whatever chilly drizzle fall can throw at it. Remember, don't wear these hiking. Ballet flats are, at best, suited to city wear and running errands not in the rough. Look for pairs that are washable so you can easily throw them in the laundry to wash out the day's sins. Waterproof ballet flat brands include Oka-B and Blondo.

### **DUCK BOOTS**

When it's a real gullywasher, a pair of well made duck boots never go out of style. Originally made by L.L. Bean, the duck boot features a rubber bottom with a leather or other material upper, tied with laces. Ever since duck boots had a fashion moment a few years ago, they're everywhere now and even come in duck boot-inspired ballet flats and in plenty of fashion-forward colors.

### **WATERPROOFING SPRAYS**

Of course, you can always

make your favorite shoes waterproof with treatments. However, be aware that you might be sacrificing those shoes if you don't pay close attention to the instructions. WhoWhatWear recommends sprays by Kiwi (solely devoted to shoes), Scotchgard and Crep Protect.

### Ace the Natural Makeup Look

For a nude lip, you need a tone that matches your skin tone pretty exactly, Cosmopolitan magazine says, but for eyeshadow, you can go farther afield. Look for a palette that includes a variety of shades and tones to accent your every look.

### How to Pick the Right Hat

If you think that you're not a hat person, consider the fact that maybe you just haven't found the right hat.

Much like a hairdo, you have to pick the right hat for your face shape.

But first, you need to find your size. To do that, the experts at Hats.com say, measure your head by using a measuring tape or anything else flexible. Even a charger cord would work; just lay it

against a ruler after to wrap it around your head to measure the circumference. That will help find your hat size. Now, to find your face shape.

### **LONG FACES**

Long faces are longer than they are wide. They look better in hats with wide brims. Think cowboy hats, sun hats or hats that cut across the forehead to shorten the face. Avoid beanies; they can make the face look too long.

### **ROUND FACES**

If you have a round face, you'll want to choose a hat that has all the features your face doesn't. Namely, angles. Look for retro styles like the fedora or the cloche hat. A beanie pulled low also works to help elongate your face (the same reason why those with long faces want to avoid it).

### **SQUARE FACES**

A square face sports strong, angular features. Soften a square face with floppy or wide-brimmed hats. Cloches look particularly nice and, again, avoid beanies.

### **HEART-SHAPED FACES**

These faces are wider in the upper part of the face with a narrow jaw. You want to avoid floppy brims, which may make the wider upper part of your face look too wide. Go with baseballs caps, newsboy hats or fedoras to make you love your heart face.

### **OVAL FACES**

Lucky you! Hats.com says you can wear almost any style that suits your fancy.

#### DIAMOND FACE

These faces are narrow at the top and bottom with the width in the upper part of the face. Wear a hat farther back on the head or a hat with a shallow crown to mitigate the shortening of the face. Look for pull-on hats and pork pie hats.

### Sustainable Brands

Even high fashion is going green lately.

A concentrated effort to battle the effects of climate change and the human effect on the environment means that more and more brands are choosing to highlight their efforts to reduce their waste, reuse and recycle goods. Here are some brands that are making a special effort.

### **THE SAK**

Accessories manufacturer
The Sak is now using recycled
materials and responsible
sourcing in their bags, with a
goal to be 100% sustainable
by 2024. Look for bags made
with The Sak's Eco-Jersey
material, which is made from
recycled fibers. Also of note,
the Gaia line, made from recycled bottles, and the
Mendocino collection, made
from plastic collected from
the ocean.

### LEVI'S

It takes more than 2,000 gallons of water to make a single pair of jeans, so Levi's is changing their processes to use less water. The new Water<Less collection claims to use up to 96% less water to make.

### **H&M CONSCIOUS**

The discount clothier's conscious line focuses on lessening the company's environmental impact, using materials like organic cotton and recycled polyester. H&M has a goal to reach 100% recycled or

sustainably sourced clothing by 2030.

### **POLO RALPH LAUREN**

The Earth Polo is made of recycled water bottles and uses dyes that don't require water to apply. The company says the shirts will waive the equivalent of 170 million plastic bottles from landfills by 2025.

### **VERA BRADLEY**

The company's ReActive col-

lection is made from recycled plastic bottles. It comes in backpacks, totes, travel bags and more, all in Vera Bradley's signature prints and solids.

### **PATAGONIA**

It makes sense for outdoors brand Patagonia to be one of the world's best ethical clothiers. The brand uses sustainable materials, helps you get their clothing repaired, and has collections that are Fair Trade Certified and Bluesign approved. It also resells its own styles, meaning you can get credit for turning in your old coat and buying a new one, or you can buy a pre-owned item at a lower cost.

### **COLUMBIA**

This is another outdoors brand looking to improve its sustainability through the production process. The Outdry Eco jackets are made from recycled water bottles and don't use dyes. This saves more than 24 gallons of water per jacket, the company says.

### **ATHLETA**

The activewear brands says that 60% of its products are made with sustainable materials, including recycled polyester. The company is also B Corp Certified, meaning it meets strict social and environmental standards.
