There are many projects that can incorporate this motif.



The Craft Industry Alliance lists foraged finds as one of the major craft trends for fall 2023, a movement that taps into crafters' interest in sustainability, nature-based activities and the desire for unique, personalized creations.

One of the primary driving forces is a heightened awareness of environmental issues and a desire to reduce one's carbon footprint. Rather than using plastic or things that require fossil fuel to create, crafters are harvesting branches, pine cones, leaves and stones to create beautiful and functional items that don't contribute to waste or resource depletion.

Foraged finds are often imperfect and therefore more individual, distinguishing them from mass-produced items. Those who go foraging or wild-crafting report that it helps them to connect with nature on a deeper level. It encourages outdoor exploration and greater appreciation for the natural world. It's a way to bring the beauty of the outdoors into one's home or per-



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sonal style.

The rise of social media platforms such as Pinterest, Instagram and crafting forums has facilitated the sharing of ideas and creations related to foraged finds. Crafters from around the world now have a platform to showcase their projects, exchange tips and inspire others to join the movement.

INSPIRING PROJECTS

Some wildcrafters forage for specific items for planned projects. Others venture forth and let their harvest inspire them. Things that can be collected include seashells, driftwood, pine cones, seeds, mushrooms, moss, clay, stones or berries.

At The Druid's Garden, Dana O'Driscoll recommends putting together a foraging bag that includes such things as sunscreen, bug spray, a hat, compass, water, first-aid supplies, gardening tools, gloves and scissors.

Craft Invaders offers several videos in its "12 Fabulous Nature Based Craft Tutorials" that provide instructions on making such things as cards, candles, living sculptures, dried clay leaves and flower pots. Other people make jewelry, home decor, soaps and fashion accessories.

ETHICAL FORAGING

There is some controversy around wildcrafting, especially when done for profit, and it is important that crafters follow ethical foraging practices. This includes respecting natural habitats, not over-harvesting and adhering to local regulations and guidelines to ensure the sustainability of the environment.

Forage only where you have permission to do so and do not take things that are endangered or scarce. Do not disrupt an ecosystem. Many wildcrafters emphasize the importance of acknowledging the ancestral lands and traditions from which wildcrafting comes.

O'Driscoll connects wild-crafting with re-skilling, "developing the skills necessary to transition to a sustainable and earth-centered future. ... This is what our ancestors did — and this is what we will again do — if we can learn to do it correctly and in balance."

DIY Disco Planters

This fall's trends include splashes of retro-inspired glamour.

DIY disco planters continue to climb in popularity. MadeUrban reports that "disco ball planter" went from a couple hundred searches per month in 2019 to more than 5,000 searches per month in 2022 with the trend carrying over into 2023.

These funky creations combine the charm of vintage disco balls with the beauty of greenery, giving any space a vibrant touch. They add a touch of nostalgia to your home and garden while providing a delightful conversation starter. There are several ways to make a planter from purchasing a disco ball to making one with reflective chips that you glue onto a plastic bowl.

Here is one way to make this fun craft.

Supplies

Disco ball: Start with a disco ball. You can find these at party supply stores, online market-places or even thrift shops.

Small potted plant: Select a small, indoor plant that thrives in your chosen location.

Drill with a diamond bit: Make sure you have a diamond bit suitable for drilling through glass or mirrored surfaces.

Plant holder/pot Adhesive putty or epoxy Chain or twine

Potting soil and fertilizer: For your plant's well-being, invest in quality potting soil and a slow-release fertilizer.

Directions

Step 1: Prepare your disco ball. Clean the surface thoroughly to ensure proper adhesion.

Step 2: Create a hole.
Carefully drill a hole at the top of the disco ball. This hole should be large enough to accommodate the plant's pot, so measure accordingly. Take your time, as drilling through glass can be delicate work. Drill two small holes on opposite sides of the opening so you can attach hangers.

Step 3: Attach hangers.
Thread a chain or colorful twine through the small holes on the top of your disco ball planter.
Securely fasten it as the weight of the disco ball and plant can add up.

Step 4: Attach the plant holder. Apply adhesive putty or epoxy around the hole you just created. Press your plant holder (the pot) into the adhesive, ensuring it sticks firmly. Allow it to dry and set according to the product's instructions.

Step 5: Pot your plant. Fill the pot with potting soil and insert your plant, adding more soil as needed. Water the plant thoroughly and add slow-release fertilizer per the package instructions.

Step 6: Find the perfect spot. Choose a location that allows your disco planter to catch the light. Sunlight or spotlights will bounce off the mirrored surfaces, creating mesmerizing reflections around your space. Indoor areas near windows or outdoor spots with dappled sunlight are ideal.
